**Beacon House Checklist**

Pre-Admission

\_\_\_\_\_ We ask candidates to commit to a 6-9 month minimum stay.

\_\_\_\_\_ Residents must be willing to attend IOP and aftercare.

\_\_\_\_\_ If a client has been administered Suboxone their admit date at BH is typically 10+ days after their last dose.

\_\_\_\_\_ Clients cannot be on medication that can be abused or has “street value”. Examples of contraband medications are Adderall, Neurontin, Trazadone, anti-anxiety benzos, etc. If a client has recently stopped taking a prescribed psychotropic medication, they will need to provide us with a discontinue order from their physician. If you have any questions about a particular medication please do not hesitate to be in touch.

\_\_\_\_\_ We can handle clients with co-occurring psychiatric conditions such as anxiety, depression and bi-polar as long as they are receiving treatment, but are not as well equipped to handle severe and/or untreated psychiatric conditions.

\_\_\_\_\_ Sex offenders are not permitted due to proximity of a school.

\_\_\_\_\_ Residents must work full-time and/or find work within 30 days.

\_\_\_\_\_ Must be 21 years of age or older.

\_\_\_\_\_ Former BH residents who did not graduate in good standing must obtain special permission from our executive director to re-apply.

\_\_\_\_\_ Outstanding warrants need to be resolved before being admitted.

\_\_\_\_\_ Residents will need health insurance and a picture ID.

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Admissions Process

- We can schedule an interview 7 days a week 8am-11pm, and appointments within 72 hours.
  - Interviews/Assessments are performed between 10am-6pm, Monday – Friday.
  - Candidates for our program have two interviews. The client interviews first with an intake coordinator and then with the Substance Abuse Counselor for a second more in depth interview and assessment.
  - We have 50 beds and they are available on a first come, first serve basis.
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Main Reasons for Deferrals

- Clients are looking for a short-term, temporary place versus residential living.
- Clients taking prohibited medication and Clients with severe, untreated co-occurring mental health issues.
- Most of our clients come to us after completing a 7-28 day inpatient program. Clients without immediate prior acute treatment may be referred to an inpatient or residential program before they can reside here.
- Client does not feel they can accommodate the 2 week initial property restriction, the IOP/ meeting requirements, curfew, other house rules, or work requirements.

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### **Transitional Living Model**

Beacon House employs two live-in resident managers, one senior resident manager, a life skills coach, a case manager with a master's degree in social work, in addition to our administrative staff.

We are the next step on the recovery continuum of care after an individual has received acute inpatient detox and/or has completed a 28 day chemical dependency residential treatment program or an equivalent while incarcerated. Most of our clients come from The Brook Hospital, Centerstone's ARC, Recovery Works, Our Lady of Peace, and Landmark, HIP, SAP, Drug Court and Jefferson County Jail.

We provide shelter with wraparound services for treatment, case management, and employment.

Our daily programming includes intensive outpatient treatment (IOP), individual and family counseling at The Morton Center, access to a psychiatrist and general healthcare provider with specialization in addictions, a Vivitrol program, life skills course, weekly case management meeting, daily 12 step meetings, meetings with sponsor and in-house mentor program, community meetings and organized volunteer/service work.

Transitional Living, Sober Living and Halfway Houses fall on a spectrum of structure and services. Some halfway houses offer shelter and minimal supervision, while others require residents to give up their jobs, cell phones and stay on site for 90 days. The Beacon House differs from most by blending the peer driven model of recovery residences with the clinical treatment services of a Behavioral Health Service Organization (BHSO).

We bridge the gap between acute treatment and returning home by providing shelter and treatment.



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
